Providing support for accessible transport vehicles

The Victoria Foundation awards grants to help fund much needed accessible transport vehicles which provide a lifeline for the frail, elderly and disabled. A fully accessible minibus can cost £65,000.



How your donations help and a message of thanks

In 2017 TVF awarded a grant of £8,000 to FiSH Neighbourhood Care towards the cost of replacing its ageing accessible minibus. The new minibus will help to deliver over 60,000 passenger journeys over its six to seven year life span for frail, elderly, disabled and isolated residents living in the areas of Barnes, Mortlake and East Sheen.

TVF also helped make SeeAbility's dream of a new accessible minibus become a reality by awarding a grant of £3,000. The minibus based at the charity's Millennium Centre, Leatherhead, will provide accessible transport to those with sight loss and multiple disabilities. It will help them to pursue their goals, to get active and really go places by taking groups and individuals on trips to access sport, leisure and to participate in educational excursions.



Clare Oades, Manager at SeeAbility's Millennium Centre, said:

'...It was a real lift for everyone in the centre to connect with local people, community groups ... **and win the amazing grant from The Victoria Foundation. This new minibus will make such a difference to the lives of the people we support.'**
