Strathmore is a special school for children and young people aged 4 -19 with severe and complex learning difficulties including those with an additional diagnosis of autism and/or physical/sensory disabilities.

Strathmore's aim is to ensure that learners leave the school as independent as they can be and we place huge value on ensuring visibility and participation in the wider community. Strathmore's current minibus, which is more than 12 years old, is no longer fit for purpose as it cannot be used within the ULEZ which limits its usefulness and has started to cost significant sums in terms of servicing. The new minibus, to be used across all four school campuses, will be a 17-seater and fully accessible by means of a tail ramp with space for a wheelchair occupant - this will enable a full class of children and young adults with teaching assistants to go out on journeys together in one bus which will meet the needs of all learners and help to provide the rich and varied cultural, sporting and artistic experiences which the learners of Strathmore both enjoy and thrive on.
